INTRODUCTION

Sporting facilities are typically wide-open spaces with minimal consideration for spectator or player shade protection or seating. Regardless of the size or location of the facility, shade and seating for players, officials and spectators is essential as participation in football events can be for considerable amounts of time.

Football Queensland has created this Shelter & Grandstands Facility Guide to provide information, recommendations and solutions for clubs and local councils to install shelters and suitable seating at sporting facilities.

Sporting facilities that provide shelter and spectator seating are more likely to see an increase in crowd support which may increase canteen spending and member registrations.





SHELTERS & GRANDSTANDS

The Queensland Department of Health provides guidelines for the recommended provision of shade and grandstands for sporting fields.

Considerations from the guidelines state:

- There is a requirement for 100% shade protection for players when they are off the field if possible.
- Shade should not hinder spectator view.
- Grandstands should face south if possible.
- Additional design features can improve the shade protection for grandstands
 e.g., installation of adjustable screening hung vertically from the front of the
 grandstand roof and the side screening particularly on the northern and western
 sides
- Provision of multilingual signs highlighting:
 - o The daily UV indexes.
 - o The five sun protection behaviours
 - o Locations where shade is provided at this facility.

Quality & Effective Structures

Correctly positioned and well-designed shelters and grandstands can provide protection from UV radiation all year round for players and spectators.

Well-designed shelters should:

- Provide a barrier that protects users from direct and indirect sources of UV radiation.
- Provide shade that is practical, attractive, and environmentally friendly.
- Ensure the outdoor space is comfortable to use in all seasons.
- The structure considers air temperature, humidity, air movement and heat radiated from the sun and surroundings.


Well-designed grandstands should:

- Require little maintenance.
- Designed for the Queensland environment including:
 - Cyclone rating for Northern regions.
 - Will not rust or fade when left in exposed locations.
- Be portable if unable to be permanently secured.
- Be fully enclosed between tiers for safety.
- Include safety and security measures e.g., mesh safety surround for multi-tiered grandstands.





Project Considerations & Checklist



Conducting a Shelter & Grandstand Inventory

Assess your facility and identify areas where large amounts of activity take place particularly where people congregate. This usually includes areas close to a canteen, spectator viewing points and off-field areas near dugouts.

Prioritising Shelter & Grandstand Sites

Using the shade inventory list, assess each area using these criteria:

- Time of Use
 - Particularly between 11am and 3pm when UV radiation levels are generally the highest.
- Duration of Use
 - The longer the exposure to UV radiation, the greater the risk of harm.
- Level of Use
 - High use areas should take priority over sites that are used less often.

Conducting a Shelter & Grandstand Audit

A shelter and grandstand audit has five steps:

- 1. Determine the usage patterns of the site.
- 2. Determine the amount of useability of existing shade and seating at the site.
- 3. Consider the effects of reflected UV radiation.
- 4. Assess the need for improved or increased shade and seating at the site.
- 5. Identify possible options to improve shade and seating at the site.

Planning & Implementing

Post completing the audit, the final steps in completing the project include planning, implementing, managing, and evaluating.

These steps should be done in consultation with a shelter and grandstand structure specialist who will assist the club in:

- Forming a project team to develop the project.
- Draw up a detailed site plan.
- Provide suitable shelter and grandstand options for the selected site/s
- Quote on suitable product options (to include installation and project management
 - Includes preparing a design brief to assist in securing funding.
- Identify what permits, approvals and documentation is required.
 - Consultation with building and planning departments of local council is required to ensure project approval.
- Determine any external constraints e.g. heritage issues, environmental impact considerations
- Develop a timeline for the project.

Funding & Financial Support

A variety of funding opportunities exist for sporting clubs to purchase infrastructure. View open and relevant funding programs here.

Financing is also available for sporting clubs through Felton's finance partner Finlease. Clubs can apply for finance <u>here</u> and download an infographic highlighting ten good reasons to consider financing.

Eligible sporting clubs can also claim an immediate deduction for the business portion of the cost of an asset in the year the asset if first used or installed ready for use.
