PARTICIPANTS

It is important that we deliver relevant products and programs to cater for participation growth in a sustainable way.

- Develop localised participation experiences using national and state products – including school programs, Walking Football programs, MiniRoos Kick-off and more – aligned with Football Queensland's Strategic Plan priorities in this pillar
- Increase community awareness, putting football in front of the public more often
- Recruit new players through high-quality school programs, weekend/day programs and create soft entry level programs for all ages and abilities
- Create new competitions and formats that allow participants to play football all year round
- Continue to develop the SAP and TSP program throughout the Wide Bay region ensuring that all players have an opportunity to play at the highest level



WOMEN & GIRLS

Creating a supportive and welcoming environment for women and girls is essential to drive participation.

- Create localised women and girls specific programs aligned with Football Queensland's Women and Girls Strategic Plan priorities in this pillar
- Educate community clubs and members on how to foster inclusive and welcoming environments
- Develop clear pathways and competitions for women and girls to play at community and advanced level locally, state-wide and nationally



REFEREES

A welcoming referee culture and clear development pathway is essential to recruit and retain referees.

- Develop a localised referee engagement strategy aligned with Football Queensland's Strategic Plan priorities in this pillar
- Work with high schools to upskill and train teachers and students in officiating football
- Recruit younger referees through targeted programs
- Create strategies to ensure club buy-in with recruiting referees internally
- Ensure we build a welcoming and inclusive culture for new and existing referees



COACHES

Educating Wide Bay coaches is essential to encourage ongoing development and to ensure coaches deliver positive experiences and promote a supportive culture for all football participants.

- Develop a coach mentoring program for all coaches whatever their level
- Recruit, retain and upskill local coaches via a localised coach engagement strategy aligned with Football Queensland's Strategic Plan priorities in this pillar
- Work with local schools to train teachers to become football coaches





LEADERSHIP & PEOPLE

Our people are at the heart of everything we do, whether they are players, coaches, referees, volunteers, parents, spectators or administrators.

We will:

- Recruit, train and deploy talented staff to work towards clear targets and KPIs to improve and develop the local game
- Establish, recruit and support the Advisory Committee in Wide Bay
- Build strategies to reward staff and volunteers aligned with Football Queensland's Strategic Plan priorities in this pillar
- Lead and support club volunteers to improve local delivery

INFRASTRUCTURE PRIORITIES

Infrastructure is a vital component of our game to support our current player base and accommodate the expected increase in participation particularly in the fast growing women and girls demographic due to the FIFA WWC 2023. To continue to grow our game significant investment in football facilities is required to address community-wide challenges including ageing infrastructure and the need to accommodate football's diversity of users.

We will:

Conduct facility audits and assessments on all football facilities within Wide Bay

Develop an infrastructure plan for the region to prioritise infrastructure investment
