Dear Clubs

As preparations continue for the 2026 season, Football Queensland competition access via Squadi will open across the state in line with the opening dates of the national registration system PlayFootball.

For community and all other non-professional football leagues, including 2026 FQPL 2-6, FQ Academy, Community Juniors and Seniors and MiniRoos, the Squadi competition access opening dates will be January 1, 2026.

As confirmed in [FQ Memo 37-25](#), governing body fees for MiniRoos, Juniors and Seniors will remain unchanged for the 2026 season, leaving Queensland with Australia's lowest fees of any member federation.

Football Queensland has maintained a strong focus on financial discipline and strategic planning. By carefully managing resources and creating efficiencies in how the game is governed and delivered across the state, FQ has been able to limit cost pressures in a challenging economic environment. This approach has helped to minimise the impact of rising operational costs and significant inflation, ensuring participant fees remain fair and accessible for all.

Local venue fees and team fees have also been confirmed, with clubs reminded that the cost of managing regional football facilities is heavily influenced by local factors and is separate from the governance and administration of football.
